## Appropriate comments:

"Blanks is the key word. I use covers that are blank on the inside (blank side up) as "fillers" to occupy the empty space. That way you reserve the space and don't see thru to the next page. (Helps keep plastic pages flat also)."

"Only if my album is alphabetical. When it is small genre, no."

"Only if I am adding to sets."

"No, I put them in where they're suppose to go and then, periodically, I do the "shuffle"

"No no no!! Are you kidding me! I tried that with the girlie listing and had more spaces than covers?!?!"

"I try to, but I wince at all the wasted space... That gets to be expensive in plastic pages."

"Usually don't leave blank spaces. I collect 3 digit telephone numbers and leave space in this album for all new covers. Covers are arranged in ascending numerical order. I also collect small towns and as there are in alphabetical order I will leave a couple of spaces to fit new ones in."
